A home is something many of us take for granted. What happens when you are travelling or become displaced from your home for a long time? What would you need and what do you take with you? If you could only have one object what would it be; something personal or a more functional item? The first year three-dimensional design students at Bath Spa have been exploring these questions in their latest project. This collection of objects engages with the issues of portability and design within the mass-movement and displacement of people. Each student has taken a different approach to the brief set, and created a finished item for a need they identified.

**Making tents 1 + 2** **H U**  
Creative workshops throughout the weekend will be led by 5x5x5=creativity artists in the Making Tents. Please see workshop programme for further details.

**Houses of Imagination** **L K O T**  
A series of site-specific installations designed and built by Architecture and Civil Engineering students from the University of Bath led by six volunteer architects from Feilden Clegg Bradley Studios together with Toby Lewis (Teaching Fellow and 5th Year Leader).

**Circus in the Meadow, Ring of Giant Acorns** **E**  
**Grant Associates, Herman Miller**  
The architect of the Circus, John Wood, used over 108 stone acorns around the Circus buildings to reflect the story of King Bladud and his pigs discovering the waters of Bath whilst foraging for acorns. Bath, as a city, grew from this moment and established the enduring relationship between the city and the countryside.

Our ring of giant acorns reminds visitors of the story of King Bladud and is a playful intervention in the landscape, creating a place to gather, to take photos, to play hide and seek...

**Seeking Sounds Nest** **F**  
**Neil Glen and Carpenter Oak & Woodland**  
The forest is home to all kinds of creatures, moving invisibly but not silently around the trees and plants, underneath the soil or from above. Seeking Sounds invites you to explore the a physical forest using one of our Sound Seekers, or creating your own. This amazing device will allow you to hear hidden creatures scurrying through the undergrowth or moving through the earth, gnawing on wood or eating leaves, or simply calling out, can you identify the sounds?

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**Cocoonery** **I**  
**Alison Harper**  
The Cocoonery is an area of the Forest where creatures rest, sleep, slumber and grow before emerging into the sunlight. The only sound is a gentle snoring and the only movement a turn of a body to settle more closely into the snug comfort of their cocoon. Cocoons are home to a multitude of creatures from silkworms to spiders.

This 'cocooning' process encourages us as humans, secure in our 'homes', to engage with and to care about and protect the safe places which other life forms and creatures need in order to grow and thrive. Alison will be running workshops over the weekend at the Cocoonery (please see workshop programme).

**Indoors Outdoors** **L**  
**National Trust Bath Skyline**  
As part of the event theme, 'where we feel at home', the Skyline team will be literally putting your coffee table and sofa in the middle of a field, to bring the indoors outdoors.

A traditional sitting room, with sofas made from hay bales, (made from hay produced in the meadows around the Bath Skyline) brought into the pasture of Bushey Norwood. The wild sitting room will provide some relaxing space and will also host a number of wildlife inspired crafts for children and adults alike.

**Skying Space, Aerocene Explorer** **M**  
**Aerocene Foundation,**  
**a project founded by artist**  
**Tomás Saraceno and his studio**  
Aerocene Explorer launches are planned for each day but times will be dependent on weather conditions. An exhibition of the Aerocene Explorer will be available to view in The Edge.

The Aerocene Explorer is a tethered-flight starter kit, which enables anyone to personally launch their own Aerocene solar sculpture and start exploring the skies. Initiated by artist Tomás Saraceno and developed in an ongoing open-source collaboration with multiple individuals, all parts of the Explorer are free for anyone to reproduce or build upon. A tactile and engaging way to experience the Aerocene, the Explorer allows participants to capture aerial images and collect atmospheric data using non-intrusive, emission-free scientific exploration tools. Additionally participants can 'hack' the technical devices to create their own lightweight sensors and lift them up.

**FOREST OF IMAGINATION IS FREE AND OPEN TO ALL**

The fourth Forest of Imagination takes the idea of our 'natural home' into the unique landscape of Bushey Norwood, a National Trust meadow right on the edge of the city of Bath. This prehistoric meadow landscape, with mature open grown trees surrounded by pockets of woodland and elevated views has been inhabited for thousands of years. It provides the perfect setting to explore the idea of where we feel most at home – in the city or in nature.

The idea of 'home' is explored by mixing up representations of our human, urban homes with the natural habitat/homes of the flora and fauna that live on Bushey Norwood. Planet Earth is our wider home and Aerocene Explorer, by the Aerocene Foundation, explores the importance of our planet's atmosphere.

Through collaboration with creative partners in Bath and beyond we have developed an engaging and thought provoking series of experiences for all ages but with an emphasis on children and their connection with the natural environment. The project reinforces a renewed interest in the countryside around the city through the Bathscape project and highlights the importance of engaging people, especially children, with the experience of nature and outdoor play. The National Trust is a key partner in this year's event and this project will be a real focus for their own promotion for active engagement of children in the countryside.


